The **Permanent Timeline Display** tracing the development of Radlett has been updated and passed to Hertsmere Print Services, who will produce a glossier and more durable version. In the meantime, the current version continues to be displayed.

The current subsidiary display is of **"Local Art Past and Present**" and features paintings of local buildings, places, events and people. An additional display of **"The History of the Radlett Art Society**" is now up and will run until 24th June. This will coincide with the 50th Summer exhibition by the Radlett Art Society on Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th of June, when the Museum will be open from 10am to 4pm.

A team of Trustees and volunteers is currently preparing a display featuring the **Radlett Murder**, which occurred 200 years ago and made national headlines. It is planned to be presented in late September.

Three Museum plaques have recently been erected on local buildings of historical interest – **The Red Lion Hotel**,

the **Flint Cottages** opposite the The Red Lion and the World War II **Report Centre** on the edge of Scrubbitts Wood in Gills Hill. More information about each of these plaques is available in the Museum. Further such plaques are planned.

A very successful fund-raising **Quiz Supper** was held at the Vision Hall in March. The quiz was prepared by one of our volunteers, Pete Turner, and compered by celebrity **Matt Lucas**.
